In addition, any paper materials were made using Forest Stewardship Council (FSC) approved sources. Meals, where possible, include Fair-Trade products and local produce.

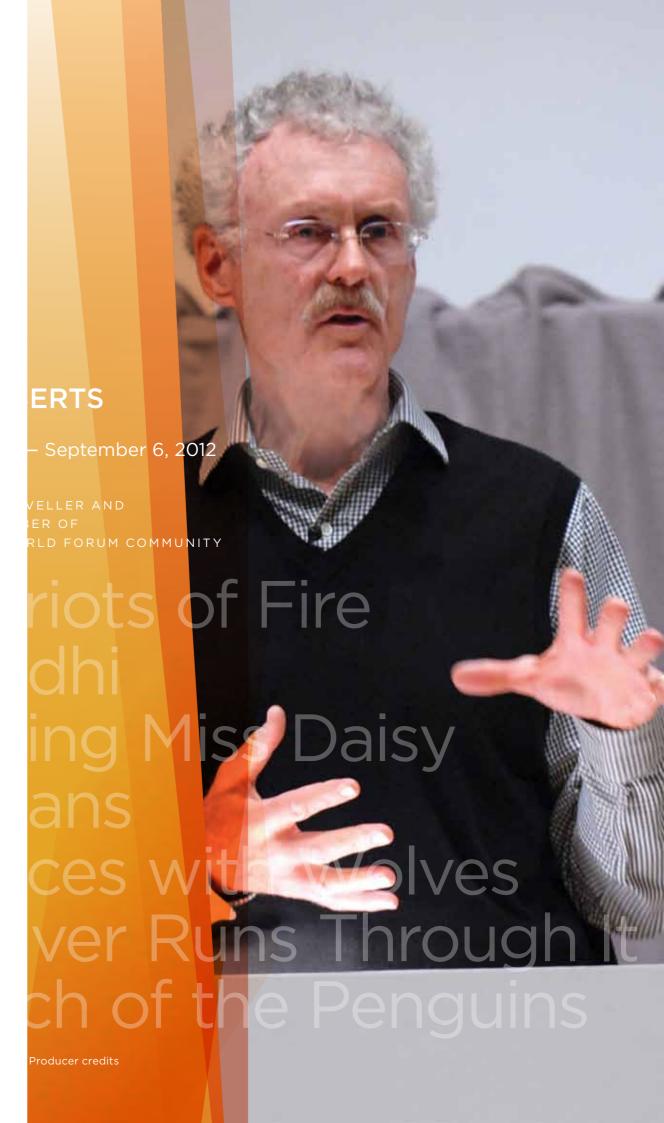
Specific practices include:

- Encouraging mass transit to the Forum from London
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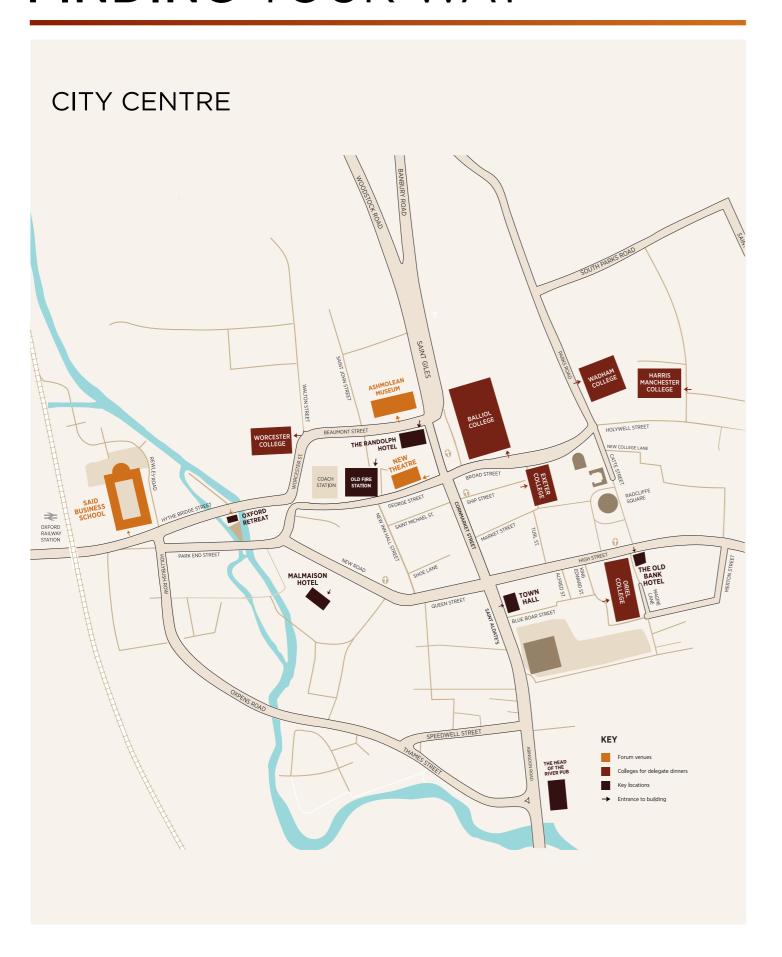
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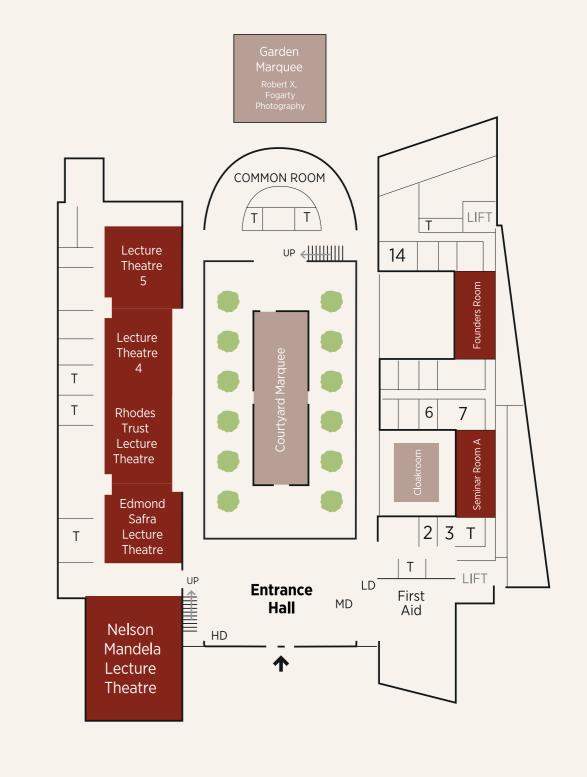
