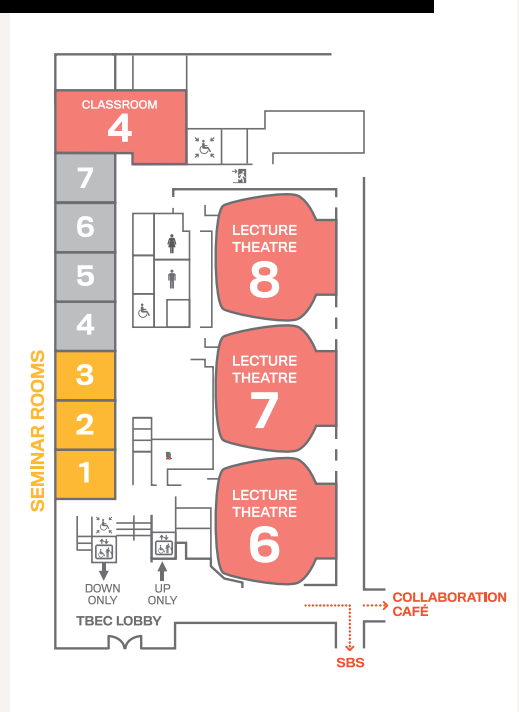

## FLOOR PLAN



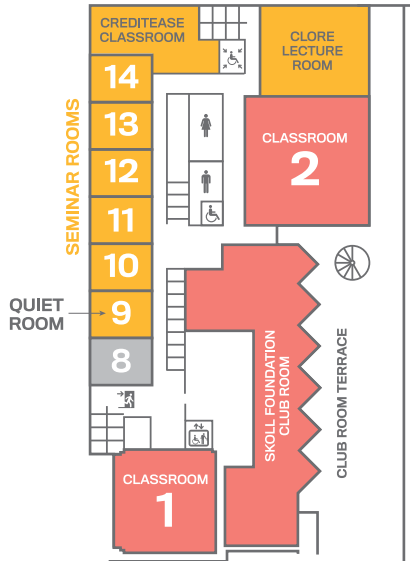

## FLOOR PLAN - 1<sup>ST</sup> / GROUND FLOOR



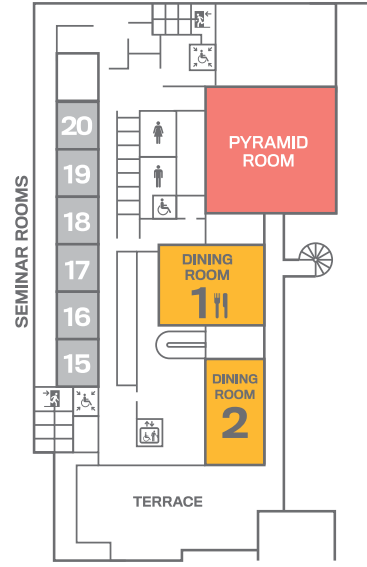

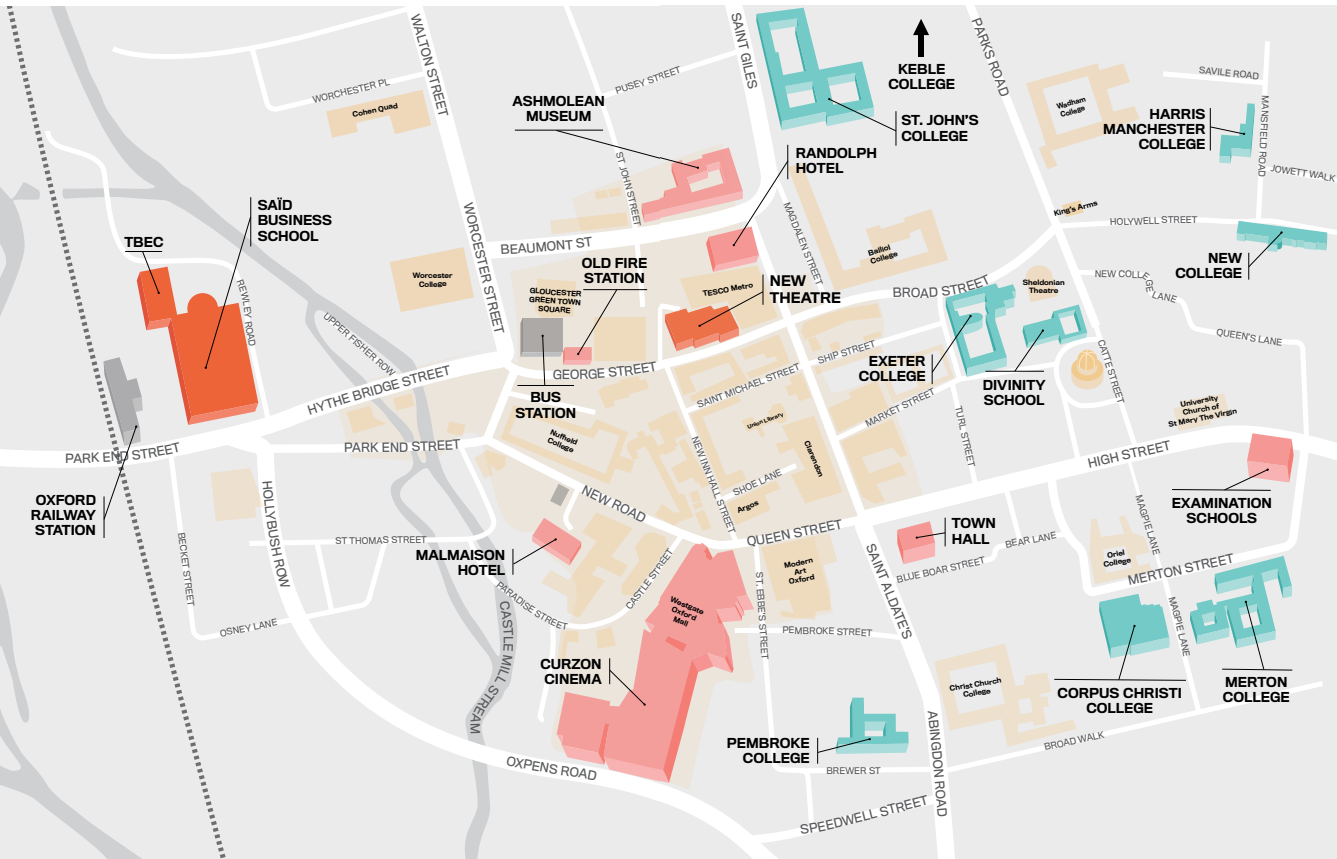
### FLOOR PLAN - 2<sup>ND</sup> FLOOR
